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BLADDER CYSTOSCOPY



Bladder cystoscopy – is an endoscopic examination, including a visual examination of the walls of urethra, bladder and openings to the ureters with the help of optics for detecting pathology, targeted sampling of biomaterial (simultaneous biopsy) if pathological foci are detected, administering drugs.

The examination allows not only to examine the bladder cavity, but also to evaluate the functions of each kidney separately by the nature of the discharge from the right and left openings to the ureter, since they open into the bladder and are well visualized during the procedure; can be used as an auxiliary method for the diagnosis of adenoma or malignant neoplasm of the bladder.



Indications for the procedure

The examination is indicated for the following disorders, diseases:

- cystitis (acute painful and unpleasant sensations during urination);
- tumors;
- hematuria (blood in the urine);
- pyuria (purulence in the urine);
- enuresis (urinary incontinence);
- presence of any neoplasms;
- traumatic injuries (urethral stricture);
- urolithiasis;
- abnormal development of the urinary system, etc.
